The practice continues to grow from strength to strength and we have been involved in an educational campaign for the NHS where our practice and our model of care that we have adopted have been highlighted and demonstrated throughout the country as a model that NHS England would like other practices to consider adopting. We also starred in a feature for ITV Westcountry News, highlighting our practice and the way we provide care for our patients. We now have our new Travel Vaccine service up and running and this has benefitted not only our patients but the whole population in Cornwall and no longer do patients need to leave the county in order to get their travel vaccinations. This has been particularly important for local school children who need vaccinations for school trips abroad. We have also become a Research practice where we now help RCHT and the NHS in the use of new and innovative medicines. This service has already started to benefit our patients at the practice as cohorts of our patients are being given the opportunity to have new and life-changing medicine that is not currently available on the NHS. We are incredibly proud of being part of this and contributing to advancement in health outcomes and medicines for the UK population.

Dr Smithson is shortly going on maternity leave and we wish her and her family all the very best and look forward to her return next year. We have several new GPs joining the practice as well as two new Advanced Nurse Practitioners which will continue to strengthen our already strong on-call team. We also have two full-time social prescribers joining us making a really strong Probus Care Team alongside our amazing Care Coordinator, Rebecca. We also had some of our staff recognised for their outstanding contributions to health care with our very own lead nurse Laura reaching the final 3 for Nurse Lead of the Year and our Care Coordinator Rebecca coming runner-up in the Non-Clinical colleague of the year.

Probus Surgery have become a Research Practice in association with our private business Cornwall Medical Group. We now work with RCGP and RCHT to help provide the latest cutting edge drugs, medicines and treatments that are not currently on the NHS to our patients. We have currently just completed a study on Weight Loss for our diabetic patients where 177 of our patients had the opportunity to use a weight loss medication that is currently not available on the NHS due to its cost.

The results have been amazing and to be able to offer such a service to our patients whilst creating another revenue stream for the business has been amazing. We are now about to trial a medication to help those living with schizophrenia with our patients being exclusively given the chance to have this life changing medicine.

Probus continue to be one of the leading Green practices in the UK. Our own Partner Spencer Casey has spoken several times nationally on the green work the Practice continue to do and has helped practices all over the country improve their green efficiencies. The savings made with the green projects done at Probus has allowed investment to be made in other areas such as extra staff or new technology allowing the Probus Group to continue to grow and improve. We are proud to be seen as one of the leading practices in the UK as the NHS strive to reach their net zero target by 2040.

- 3 Sending the paper request slip into the surgery, or at one of our branch/delivery sites

This is the most efficient and secure way to ask your question and we will aim to respond within 5 days. The Dispensary phone lines are open daily from 9am-10am, and 5-6pm to answer urgent queries only.

Did you know, if you pay for your prescriptions you could save money with a prepayment certificate (PPC)?

- o From 1st April 2023 the prescription charge in England is £9.65 per item.
- o A PPC costs £31.25 for 3 months, or £111.60 for 12 months.
- o A HRT PPC covers certain HRT medicines for a set priced of £19.30 and is valid for 12 months.
- o Before buying a PPC, you can check if you are entitled to free NHS prescriptions and other help with health costs at www.nhsbsa.nhs.uk/check-if-youre-eligible-help



You can buy a PPC **online**, or **in-person** at some pharmacies.


